This year's green waste recycling event was moved to the middle of May for warmer weather to help insure that the fine flashy fuels were established. Driving around the community a few days before the recycling event started it was noticeable that residents were serious as they had staged their green waste in piles, in trucks and trailers and bags on nearly every street in the community.

Opening day got off to a great start with more trailer loads of green waste than any previous single day since the program began.

The following day a cold spell began with bouts of rain-snow and high winds that lasted through the week. When the 8 day event ended the total vehicle count was down from the 2010 totals but the overall tonnage of green waste collected and recycled exceeded all previous years.

Special thanks goes out to SBCFD Fuels Crew, CR&R, Code Enforcement and the large number of volunteers who worked through cold-wet and windy conditions to make this year's event the largest ever.

The Green Waste Recycling has now exceeded 1.25 million pounds in its 5th year.
